Important points

The Master of Science (MSc) Health and Medical Education and the Master of Science (MSc) Health and Medical Simulation programmes have been developed to meet the needs of practitioners with a special interest in medical education or simulation-based medical education whilst benefiting from shared, interprofessional learning.

Both programmes have been popular amongst a range of health care professionals including physicians, surgeons, anaesthetists, paediatricians, psychiatrists, nurses, midwives, critical care outreach nurses, resuscitation officers, physiotherapists, paramedics, ODP's, simulation educators and simulation technicians.

Each pathway is aimed at practitioners wanting to undertake further specialist development and expand their career aspirations in either medical education or simulation-based medical education, providing an inter-professional and intra-professional workforce focus.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2021 – 2022

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022

Due to the ongoing effects of the pandemic some teaching sessions may be delivered online. Therefore, to study online you will need access to a suitable computer or similar electronic device and a good reliable Internet connection, which may incur additional expenses.

Please note that our Learning Resource Centres (LRCs) have PCs and Macs available to use, including hispec PCs. The university also has laptop loans available at both LRCs and provide a remote desktop portal service to allow users to access the software on Lab and LRC Windows PCs when not on campus.
